Please be sure your accounts are cleared before Friday, the last day of school. Please call the bookkeeper, Lilli Alexander, if you have any questions.

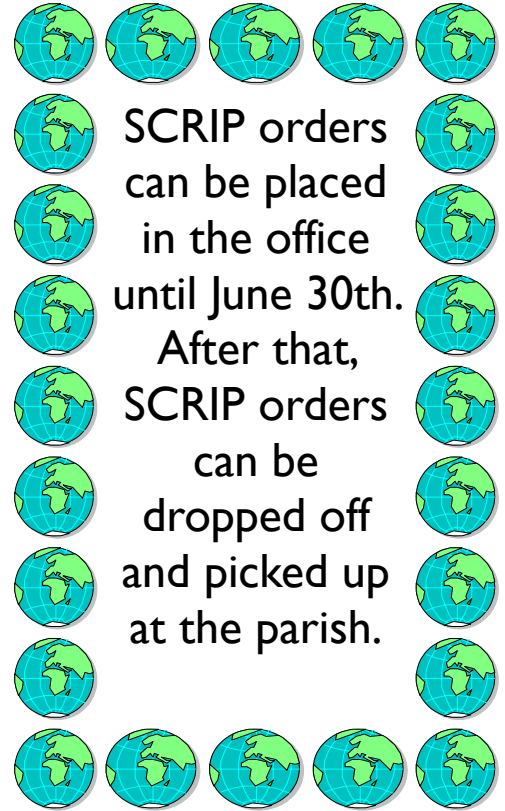
Mission Statement:
